


### **OUR COMMITMENT TO YOUR INVESTMENT**




For every dollar donated, 88 cents go directly toward helping our neighbors!


#### Hours of Individualized Care

## SERVING OUR COMMUNITY

During the past fiscal year, WE...

- supported more than 800 individuals.
- provided over 2,000 hours of one-to-one support, valued at more than \$129,000 at no cost to clients or the community.
- invested over \$136,000 into the community to address client needs through their crisis situations.
- assisted 23 families in avoiding eviction and remaining intact in their homes before the eviction moratorium.
- provided 2,126 beds during the Emergency Winter Shelter season (Dec 2 – Apr 3): a 20% increase!
- extended the Emergency Winter Shelter until May 29, 2020 due to COVID-19. During the extension, 13 individuals were served with an additional 367 beds.

# OVERFLOWING GRATITUDE

During the past fiscal year, YOU...

- our community of supporters and friends, increased your donations by 28%.
- our dedicated group of volunteers, gifted over 7,100 hours, valued at more than \$181,000. This is a 29% increase!
- shared in-kind donations valued at more than \$46.000.
- our special partner, generously gifted ECHOS Properties Inc (established July 2019) with a house in November 2019, valued at \$215,000! This house is now utilized by one of ECHOS' Housing Stability Programs.

### A Bright Future

A community dream now becoming a reality; Community Place on Washington (CPOW) (61 E. Washington St, Elizabethtown) is expanding to develop a broader social services complex! This new building will host ECHOS' Emergency Winter Shelter and Enrichment Center, ECHOS' offices and programs, six crisis (transitional) housing units, and will be shared with community partners.

## **Expanding Programs to Meet Needs**

ECHOS' core service will always be the caring relationships and personal connections that offer support. It is an honor to walk alongside our neighbors, serving as a helping hand and a listening ear while empowering resiliency and stability. Because of your support, ECHOS continues to expand its programs and meet increasing community needs.



## **CARING** FOR THOSE WITH DISABILITIES

ECHOS' Home2Stay program launched in November 2019, providing longer-term transitional housing to assist individuals and families with disabilities as they work toward stability.



#### **SUPPORTING STUDENTS IN CRISIS**

In October 2019, the local school district collaborated with ECHOS to offer Youth Crisis Response Counseling as a pilot program. After witnessing an incredible need, Youth Crisis Response Counseling is now a full-time, sustainable program within the district.



#### **HELPING** PEOPLE THRIVE

Enrichment Services launched in January 2020 to provide individuals and families direct assistance in navigating, connecting to, and securing basic needs and necessary services like food and clothing banks, mental health services, and employment resources.

ECHOS has built up 99 days in reserves: over halfway to our goal (180 days)! As we provide various services using a multifaceted approach, appropriate levels of funding are needed for sustainability and growth.
