Settled into our new home on the Community Place on Washington (CPOW) campus, ECHOS has served an unrivaled number of community members, more than any year before. With each individual life touched, there is a greater impact on the community, and building and maintaining a strong community is what ECHOS has set our sights on.

So many of our community members come to us without a place they can call home. Some have been surviving by sleeping on the couches of friends and family members, some seek shelter in their car, and others have an eviction notice looming to take away a place they did call home. Many face barriers and other uncertainties that most of us could not imagine, like...

How long can I stay here? How am I going to afford rent this month? Can I park and sleep here safely? How do I tell my children that we don't have anywhere to go tonight? When will I get a break?

ECHOS is honored to work with community partners across the northwest region of Lancaster County that share our dedication to helping our neighbors find stability in their lives, to help them break the cycle of housing insecurity so that they can reach their full potential.

EXTENDED MONTHS FOR AN EXTRAORDINARY NEED

The Elizabethtown Emergency Shelter just finished its seventh shelter season after extending an additional month until April 29, 2022. ECHOS saw unprecedented numbers this season and would not have been able to serve those seeking shelter without the new shelter space on the Community Place on Washington (CPOW) campus.

MAKES A LIFE-CHANGING CONNECTION

Jim and his service dog, Lady, were the first residents of the ECHOS Homestead Housing Program. Jim moved into his apartment in February 2022. Prior to moving into the Homestead Housing Program, Jim was facing housing instability, and the deadline for moving from his residence was quickly approaching. During this time, Jim said he was at the end of his rope, and finding housing was proving to be difficult.

Jim found ECHOS through a community-based social media app called NextDoor. A member of the group recommended that Jim reach out to ECHOS for his housing needs. Jim called ECHOS and was identified as being a candidate for the new program. Within weeks, Jim moved into his new apartment, narrowly avoiding homelessness.

During his time at ECHOS, Jim proved to be motivated to find successful housing. He worked routinely with ECHOS Campus Housing Coordinator, Sue (pictured above), and focused on budgeting, building his credit, finding employment, and most importantly, finding an apartment to call his own. With the support of ECHOS and Veterans Affairs, Jim was able to secure employment and housing.

When reflecting on his time in the program, Jim said that ECHOS gave him the time and shelter that he needed to focus on increasing his income and finding a long-term housing solution. Jim shares, "If people follow the structure of the Homestead Housing Program, they will be successful."

OPEN ACCESS TO AN ENRICHING OPPORTUNITY

The ECHOS Enrichment Center (EC) has been open to the public since Fall 2021 and has already seen more than 315 individuals in the first 11 months of this fiscal year! It is proving to be a much-needed service that is free to anyone looking for assistance with housing, employment, or additional resources to help them become stable.

We're pleased to be able to offer EC services as a walk-in center so that our clients can utilize our resources as they need during open hours rather than having to go through the extra obstacle of setting up an appointment (although appointments are available outside of walk-in hours). Our client advocates are ready to offer reliable and up-to-date information in an accessible and welcoming center.

EC services are available year-round to assist with a variety of needs. Please be sure to familiarize yourself with what resources we provide as well as the workshops that we currently have scheduled.
